The recommended way to rehearse is to begin and end with fast-paced activities, and have alternate fast and slow-paced activities throughout the middle of the rehearsal. I will keep this in mind so that I may help the students learn the best and have the process that is the most appropriate for them. Also, time allocation is critical with number of minutes to spend of warm-ups, sight-singing, rehearsing pieces, etc. I know that I will have to use this process in my rehearsal to figure out how long to spend on specific areas. and this chapter contains a process that will be helpful. The scores need to be marked and analyzed to help me the director the most, and also know what to tell the students while they are learning. The final aspect is placement of singers. This chapter gives a great deal of information about seating arrangements for singers.
